Salisbury

Salisbury is a small city surrounded by beautiful countryside. In 2004 it was voted in the top 10 British tourist destinations. There is a beautiful Gothic cathedral with the tallest medieval spire in the world at 123m high. The cathedral celebrated its 750th anniversary in 2008 with all kinds of events. The city is also famous for its Charter market on Tuesdays and Saturdays as well as Stonehenge, of course, which is only a short drive away.


